AGES AND DATES

SUMMER: 6-7 years old

OUTSIDE OF SUMMER: 8-11 years old.

DURATION

From one week.

ORGANIZATION

- From Monday to Friday, 9.00 am to 12.20 pm with two 10-minute breaks.
- Maximum of 12 students per class.
- Lunch at school included.

LEVEL

Beginner to elementary under Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

OBJECTIVES

- To propose an approach to French that awakens the child's interest in this foreign language.
- To encourage communication in French through educational activities specially designed for young children.
- Learn oral lexical skills related to their age-appropriate interests and needs: school, friends, family, home, body parts, holidays, at the beach, in a restaurant, in a shop with their family, etc.
- Develop oral and social skills involving pronunciation, essential speech acts and syntax: greeting, introducing oneself, thanking, saying goodbye, describing people, animals, objects, fruit (colours, shapes, sizes), indicating, counting, asking, accepting, refusing, stating preferences, etc.
- Oral comprehension (audio materials, teacher's instructions, etc.) .

PROGRAMME

Based on the above objectives and the starting level, a weekly programme will be developed, featuring:

- Conjugation point, concentration and reflection exercises, followed by playful and didactic activities geared to the interests of a very young audience.
- Educational activities focused on oral skills (the written part remains very limited).

METHODOLOGY

An approach to French that uses games and other creative and dynamic activities that take account of children's pace and attention levels.

The approach focuses on speaking and repetition to work on pronunciation and to establish and consolidate new vocabulary and grammar.

TEACHING MATERIALS

Use of a variety of resources and teaching materials:

- Documents with visual prompts, DVDs and audio CDs, photos, pictures, etc.
- Songs, nursery rhymes, stories, mime games.
- Cutting out, making collages, drawing, plasticine modelling, painting.
- Dynamic educational games and drama activities designed to generate enthusiasm in the classroom and in the school playground.
