

<p>European level to reach and corresponding diploma</p>	<p>Number of learning hour : average theoretical volume of learning required to reach each of the European levels.</p> <p>Number of hours in total immersion : this second volume, which is also theoretical, takes into account the immersion situation in which the learner finds himself in a French-speaking environment and follows a language course at the CIA</p>
<p>A1 – Delf A1</p>	<p>80 to 100 hours of learning 80 hours in an immersion situation <i>5 to 6 weeks in a standard course or 4 weeks in an intensive course</i></p>
<p>A2 – Delf A2</p>	<p>Level A1 + 100 to 120 hours of learning Level A1 + 90 hours in an immersion situation <i>+ 5 to 6 weeks in a standard course or 4 weeks in an intensive course</i></p>
<p>B1 – Delf B1</p>	<p>Level A2 + 150 to 180 hours of learning Level A2 + 100 to 120 hours in an immersion situation <i>+ 7 to 8 weeks in a standard course or 5 to 6 weeks in an Intensive Course</i></p>
<p>B2 – Delf B2</p>	<p>Level B1 + 200 to 250 hours of learning Level B1 +120 to 150 hours in an immersion situation <i>+ 8 to 10 weeks in a standard course or 5 to 7 in an Intensive course</i></p>
<p>C1 – Delf C1</p>	<p>Level B2 + 250 to 300 hours of learning Level B2 + 150 to 170 hours in an immersion situation <i>+ 10 to 11 weeks in a standard course or 7 to 8 in an intensive course</i></p>
<p>C2 – Delf C2</p>	<p>Level C1 + variable number of hours</p>
